WENDELL CLAY MANSFIELD

(1874-1939)

In 1910, W. C. Mansfield joined the staff of the U. S. National Museum, as a preparator for Dr. W. H. Dall. In time he completed a Doctor of Philosophy degree at George Washington University and rose through the ranks of the Geological Survey, ultimately attaining the grade of Geologist. Mansfield's interests extended the entire length of the Gulf and Atlantic Coastal Plain and resulted in almost 40 works on the faunas and stratigraphy of the area.
